"Marry Me a Little" is a musical revue with lyrics and music by Stephen Sondheim, conceived by Craig Lucas and Norman René. Called a "charming and bittersweet tale of love, loneliness, and survival," the revue showcases songs cut from final productions of "Follies," "Company," "A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum," and "A Little Night Music."

Featuring a cast of four Cornell College students, the revue-style production tells the story of singles who live in the same New York City apartment building, all fantasizing about finding love with one another.

"Each song in this show surprises us with a new revelation on our hunger for human connection," said guest director Scott Bradley. "It's been thrilling to explore this sumptuous musical score and complex story with such talented Cornell students."

With vocal direction by Christopher Okiishi, and accompaniment by Jeffrey Allen Mead, "Marry Me a Little" runs one weekend only, September 19–21 at 7:30 p.m. and September 22 at 2:00 p.m. Tickets are \$15 for adults and \$12 for seniors, students, and youth.
